	and property by strangers and/or third parties as well as enforcing and implementing MARINA's rules, policies and regulations relative to maintenance of security and safety (See Section VI. Schedule of Requirements)
6.2	Additional requirements in the performance of the security services - The security guards to be assigned shall be of:
	a. Good moral character, courteous, alert and without criminal or police record;
	b. Physically and mentally fit and not less than 21 nor more than 45 years of age;
	c. Duly licensed and properly screened and cleared by PNP, NBI, police and other government office issuing clearances for employment;
	d. Equipped with duly licensed firearms, ammunitions, nightsticks, uniforms, two-way radio, flashlight and other paraphernalia for security purposes at all times during his tour of duty.
8.1	All bid prices for a duration of 10 months (01 March - 31 December 2013) shall be fixed and shall not be adjusted during contract implementation except for the following:
	Increase in minimum daily wage pursuant to law or new wage order issued after date of bidding;
