

## **MARITIME INDUSTRY AUTHORITY SITUATION REPORT -570**

Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on 10/14/2021 in areas under MGCQ and GCQ Data generated on 10/14/2021, 3:00:00 PM

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**


- Eighty-six percent (86%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Fourteen percent (14%) of the shipping operations were affected due to the measures implemented in view Code Red Sublevel 2 for the COVID-19.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 100% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 57%.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods amid MGCQ, and GCQ is assured.



### I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On 10/14/2021, there were 146 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 126 or 86% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 126 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Bicol Region at 29% and Eastern Visayas Region at 21%.

Meanwhile, 10% of the passenger and cargo shipping operations were cancelled, all due to the community quarantine measures imposed by the different local government units governing the ships' ports of destination. Mostly affected were operations in the Central Visayas and Eastern Visayas Regions.

Five (5) passenger ships or 11% encountered delays due to the additional measures adopted in view of COVID-19 such as temperature screening and inspections.

Lastly, no shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting.

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 100 out of 100 (100%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 9 bulk carrier, 1 container ship, 3 general cargo ships, 8 LCT ships, 78 Roro cargo ships.

Twenty-six (26) passenger ships completed their voyage – 15 conventional passenger ships, 8 RoPax ships and 3 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 46 passenger ships, 43% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 20 passenger ships.
