Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on 02/10/22 in areas under MGCQ and GCQ Data generated on 02/10/22, 3:00:00 PM


HIGHLIGHTS

- Ninety-Five percent (98%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Two percent (2%) of the shipping operations were affected due to the measures implemented in view Code Red Sublevel 2 for the COVID-19.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 100% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 96%.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods amid MGCQ, and GCQ is assured.



I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On 02/10/22, there were 98 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 96 or 98% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 96 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 54% and Bicol Region at 27%.

Two (2) passenger ships or 4% encountered delays due to the additional measures adopted in view of COVID-19 such as temperature screening and inspections.

No shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting.

II. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS BY CLASSIFICATION

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 52 out of 52 (100%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 7 bulk carrier, 10 container ships, 7 LCT ships, 28 Roro cargo ships.

Forty – four (44) passenger ships completed their voyage – 29 conventional passenger ships, 9 RoPax ships and 6 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 46 passenger ships, 4% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 2 passenger ships.
