PRIORITIZATION OF SHIPYARDS ON THE DRY-DOCKING OF

PHILIPPINE-REGISTERED DOMESTIC SHIPS

In line with the Administration's initiative to support the IATF resolution for eased travel movement and in an effort to facilitate the dry-docking of ships whose dry-docking schedules were affected by the restrictions imposed during the lockdown period of the pandemic, the following notice is hereby given:

 Prioritization of the schedule of dry-docking of ships according to types as shown in the table:

Type of Ship	Allowable Extension for the Schedule of Dry- dock	Priority for Schedule of Dry- dock	Conditions
Passenger ships including RO-RO and passenger cargo	No extension	First (1 st) Priority	None
2. Tankers	No extension	Second (2 nd) Priority	None
3. General Cargo and Container ships	Three (3) months additional extension	Third (3 rd) Priority	Additional afloat safety inspection and Underwater Inspection (UWI) if the extension will result beyond 36 months from the previous Drydocking of ship
4. Barges, Tug Boats, Dredgers and other types of ships	Six (6) months additional extension	Fourth (4 th) Priority	Additional afloat safety inspection and Underwater Inspection (UWI) if the extension will result beyond 36 months from the previous Drydocking of ship

- In the event that a ship's Safety Certificate and Load Line Certificate have different validity periods, either may be granted an extension for the purpose of harmonizing the certificates. The grant of an extension is still subject to the conduct of additional afloat safety inspection.
- 3. MARINA-registered shipyards shall notify the Administration immediately once they have accepted ships for dry-dock.

The above guidelines shall be applied to all ships once, and will follow thereafter the schedule prescribed by MARINA Advisory No. 2021-14 for harmonizing the schedule of the survey and certification for all Philippine-registered domestic ships.
