
HIGHLIGHTS

- Ninety-Seven percent (97%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Three percent (3%) of the shipping operations were affected.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 100% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 94%.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods is assured.



I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On 7/17/2022, there were 115 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 112 or 97% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 112 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 46% and Bicol Region at 28%.

Three (3) passenger ships or 6% encountered delays.

No shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting.

Based on the above table, 61 out of 61 (100%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 1 chemical tanker, 12 LCT ships, 1 oil tankers, 47 Roro cargo ships.

Fifty – one (51) passenger ships completed their voyage – 29 conventional passenger ships, 14 RoPax ships and 8 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 54 passenger ships, 6% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 3 passenger ships.
