
Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on 8/30/2022 in areas under Alert Level 1 & 2 Data generated on 8/30/2022, 3:00:00 PM

HIGHLIGHTS

- Ninety-Eight percent (98%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Two percent (2%) of the shipping operations were affected.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 99% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 97%.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods is assured.


PASSENGER AND CARGO SHIPPING IN NUMBERS 8/30/2022

PASSENGER AND CARGO SHIPPING OPERATIONS IN THE PHILIPPINES

I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On 8/30/2022, there were 131 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 129 or 98% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 129 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 36% and Bicol Region at 27%.

One (1) passenger ships or 3% encountered delays.

No shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting.

II. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS BY CLASSIFICATION

Based on the above table , 93 out of 94 (99%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 7 container ships, 13 LCT ships, 73 Roro cargo ships.

Thirty – six (36) passenger ships completed their voyage – 12 conventional passenger ships, 15 RoPax ships and 9 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 37 passenger ships, 3% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 1 passenger ships.
