

MARITIME INDUSTRY AUTHORITY WEEKLY SUMMARY SITUATION REPORT - Summary 129 Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on Sep. 02 - Sep. 08, 2022 in areas under Alert Level 1 & 2

Data generated on Sep. 02 - Sep. 08, 2022, 3:00 PM

HIGHLIGHTS

- Ninety-eight percent (98%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Two percent (2%) of the shipping operations were affected.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 100% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 95%.
- Daily average passenger and cargo ship operations are 120 completed under normal conditions, cancelled trips, 3 delayed and 0 not completed voyage.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods is assured.





I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On Sep. 02 - Sep. 08, 2022, there were 490 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 478 or 98% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 478 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 58% and CALABARZON Region at 13%.

Eleven (11) passenger ships or 5% encountered delays.

No shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting, as the respective ships were still underway.

II. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS BY CLASSIFICATION

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 249 out of 250 (100%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 42 container ships, 36 LCT ships, 3 oil tankers, 160 Roro cargo ships.

Two-hundred twenty nine (229) passenger ships completed their voyage – 146 conventional passenger ships, 55 RoPax ships and 28 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 240 passenger ships, 5% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 11 passenger ships.
