Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on Oct. 21 - 27, 2022 in areas under Alert Level 1 & 2

Data generated on Oct. 21 - 27, 2022, 3:00 PM

HIGHLIGHTS

- Ninety-six percent (96%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Four percent (4%) of the shipping operations were affected.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 99% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 94%.
- Daily average passenger and cargo ship operations are 91 completed under normal conditions, 0 cancelled trips, 4 delayed and 0 not completed voyage.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods is assured.





I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On Oct. 21 - 27, 2022, there were 377 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 362 or 96% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 362 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 64% and Bicol Region at 14%.

Thirteen (13) passenger ships or 6% encountered delays.

No shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting, as the respective ships were still underway.

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 157 out of 159 (99%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 35 container ships, 21 LCT ships, 96 Roro cargo ships.

Two hundred five (205) passenger ships completed their voyage – 145 conventional passenger ships, 38 RoPax ships and 22 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 218 passenger ships, 6% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 13 passenger ships.
