MARINA ALERTS SHIPOWNERS, SEAFARERS VS "EBOLA" VIRUS SPREAD

The Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) advised all ship owners, bareboat charterers, ship operators, ship managers and manning agencies to be on the 'alert' on 'Ebola' cases in West Africa, based on reports of the World Health Organization (WHO).

In Flag State Administration Advisory No. 2014-01, MARINA Administrator Dr. Maximo Q. Mejia (Ph.D), the Ebola cases in West Africa are observed in countries such as Guinea, Sierra Leone and Liberia, hence 'all concerned' are required to consider the following recommendations from International Chamber of Shipping (ICS), International Transport Workers' Federation (ITF) and International Maritime Employers' Committee (IMEC), and should be circulated to their ships as a matter of some urgency:

- 1. The Master should ensure that the crew is aware of the risks, how the virus can be spread and how to reduce the risk;
- 2. The International Ship and Port Facility Security (ISPS) requirements on ensuring that unauthorized personnel do not board the ship should be strictly enforced throughout the duration of the vessel being in the port;
- 3. The Master should give careful consideration to granting any shore leave whilst in impacted ports;
- 4. The shipowner/ operator should avoid making new changes in the ports of an affected country, and,
- 5. After departure, the crew should be aware of the symptoms and report any occurring symptoms immediately to the person in charge of medical care.
