SUBJECT: IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CODE OF SAFE PRACTICE

FOR CARGO STOWAGE AND SECURING IN DOMESTIC

SHIPPING

Pleased be advised that in order to provide a standard equivalent in promoting the safe stowage and securing of cargoes onboard ships, the Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) shall require all concerned domestic shipping companies/operators to comply with the Code of Safe Practice for Cargo Stowage and Securing provided under Chapter for the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS) 1974, as follows:

- 1. Effective 01 July 2002, all domestic ships carrying cargo units other than solid and liquid bulk cargoes and timber stowed on deck shall have on board a Cargo Securing Manual (CSM) duly approved by the MARINA.
- All cargo units other than solid and liquid bulk cargoes and timber stowed on deck should be stowed and secured on board in accordance with the ship's CSM.
- 3. The CSM shall be valid only before major changes and alterations have been made on the general structure and intended use of the ship.
- Only personnel who have sound practical knowledge of the application and content of the CSM shall be tasked to take charge of cargo stowage and securing.
- 5. For the safe conduct of the cargo stowage and securing, the master shall ensure that the ship's approved CSM is strictly followed.

Non- Compliance with the foregoing provision shall be subject to sanctions prescribed under the Public Service Act, as amended, the Philippine Merchant Marine Rules and Regulations and pertinent MARINA Memorandum Circulars.
