SUBJECT CONTINGENCY MEASURES IN CASE OF THE

**OUTBREAK OF WAR IN IRAQ** 

All Companies operating Philippine-registered ships deployed in international voyages are hereby directed:

- 1. To advise their seafarers/crew to take all necessary precautions shall accordingly advise the nearest Philippine Embassy/Consulate of their ship's presence within the vicinity of the war zones and to communicate their need for assistance as may be warranted.
- To render assistance to any OFWs including evacuation taking into 2. consideration the safety and welfare of both crew and OFWs.
- 3. To the next possible and as may be necessary, to allow Philippine-flagged ships to accept OFWs being repatriated.
