MARINA STRATEGIC PLAN For Biennium 2018 - 2019

MANDATES

Created pursuant to PD 474 on 01 June 1974, the Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) is responsible for the development of the Philippine domestic shipping, shipbuilding, ship repair and ship breaking through investment incentives, deregulation of rates/operation, enhancement of safety standards, compulsory insurance coverage for passengers and cargoes, reasonable fines and penalties, and constructive measures for a strong and competitive merchant fleet.

As such the MARINA aims to achieve the following outcomes for the maritime industry:

- 1. Modern, vibrant and safe domestic merchant fleet as part of a seamless transportation system;
- 2. Attractive Philippine international ship registry;
- 3. The Philippines as major center for shipbuilding and shiprepair; and,
- 4. Sustained development of globally competitive seafarers.

It is also mandated to provide and help provide the necessary:

- 1. Financial assistance to the industry thru public/private financial institutions and instrumentalities;
- 2. Technological assistance; and
- 3. Favorable climate for expansion of domestic and foreign investments in shipping enterprises.

It is likewise mandated to provide for the effective supervision, regulation and rationalization of the organizational management, ownership and operations of all water transport utilities and other maritime enterprises.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) is to provide leadership in transforming the Philippines into a major maritime nation. This shall be accomplished through sustained and effective implementation of the duly accepted standards for maritime safety and security, maritime environment protection, investments promotion complemented by a competent workforce whose core values revolve around professionalism, integrity and efficiency.

VISION STATEMENT

The MARINA envisions to be the strong and dynamic maritime authority of the Philippines.

STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS

To ensure realization of this vision and contribute to the Medium Term Philippine Development Agenda's goal of promoting *"improved accessibility, mobility and interconnectivity, and safe, secure, efficient and sustainable transportation systems",* MARINA's key policy directions are guided by the following main strategic directions, from where measures, targets, programs, projects and activities have been developed collectively by all MARINA Offices in consideration of previous outputs/recommendations of the industry, namely:

- I. MARINA as Efficient and Responsible Maritime Administration
- II. Safe, Secure and Sustainable National Merchant Fleet as Part of a Seamless Transportation System
- III. Philippines as the Center for Ship Building, Ship Repair/Ship Breaking and Other Maritime Services
- IV. Philippines as the Capital for Globally Competitive Maritime Human Resource;
- V. Inclusive Accessibility and Gender Sensitive Maritime Industry

BANNER PROGRAMS AND SUB-PROGRAMS

From the wider strategic perspective, the MARINA has developed programs and sub-programs which basically links up to national economic growth in terms of investment opportunities, employment/job creation, industrial development, increased government revenues, among others, as well as strengthening the position of the Philippines in the international maritime community.

Banner Program 1 :

RESPONSIVE AND RESPONSIBLE MARITIME ADMINISTRATION

The Program aims to strengthen and further empower the MARINA to fully perform its role as the Authority of the maritime industry in the Philippines. Subprograms were identified to achieve this, to wit:

- 1 Harmonization and Expansion of Mandates
- 2 Ratification/ accession, implementation and application of international convention, instruments, protocols and other agreements
- 3 Good Governance
- 4 Strategic HR and General Administrative Support
- 5 Enhancement of Stakeholders Communication and Network
- 6 Increase visibility and strong participation in the international and regional fora / meetings

Banner Program 2: PROMOTE A CULTURE OF MARITIME SAFETY, SECURITY AND ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION

The Program aims to promote and rally amongst the industry players, including the riding public the culture of safety, security in the maritime industry and the protection of the marine environment.

Banner Program 3: STRENGTHEN THE RESERVOIR OF MARITIME HUMAN RESOURCE

The Program aims to develop and maintain a reservoir of competent maritime human resource in the area of ship operations, ship management, ship crewing, ship chandling, and other allied and ancillary services.

The Philippines remain as the leading supplier of qualified and competent seafarers in the world, hence this Program primarily aims to ensure that Filipinos shall continue to man the world's fleet; and to help prepare the seafaring industry on the emergence of autonomous ships. The Subprograms are:

- 1 Training, Education and Welfare
- 2 Certification, Licensing and Documentation
- 3 Shipyard Manpower Certification

Banner Program 4: MODERNIZE THE DOMESTIC SHIPPING

The Program aims to further modernize the domestic shipping also known as interisland shipping, which specifically focuses on the passenger/cargo ships and motorboats/bancas. Comprehensive policies on vessel retirement and replacement, financing and incentives, standardization of ship's design and the empowering the local shipyards are among the critical components of the program.

Core to this are three sub-programs, namely:

- 1 Modernization of the Roll-On/Roll-Off (RORO) Fleet
- 2 Modernization of the Motorboats/Motorbancas
- 3 Enhancement of Shipping Services

Banner Program 5:

PROMOTE AND DEVELOP THE SHIP BUILDING / REPAIR / RECYCLING INDUSTRY

This Program aims to strongly support to the modernization of the domestic shipping, i.e., standardization of ships' design appropriate to Philippine waters and infrastructure support and ships are built locally. Vessel retirement will pave the establishment of the country's ship recycling industry. Its subprograms are:

- 1 Enhancement of Shipyard competitiveness
- 2 Establishment of Recycling Industry

Banner Program 6: EXPAND THE PHILIPPINE REGISTRY

The Program aims promote the Philippines as viable option either as flag registry or second registry. It seeks to recapture if not surpass the golden days of Philippines' Overseas Shipping sector, when in the '80s, it has over 500 ships in its registry. However, it continually dwindled to a little over a hundred ships today mainly due to legislative issues. The Program includes the establishment of the Philippines' Admiralty Court and a strong lobby mechanism for the enactment of the Overseas Shipping Act.

Banner Program 7: PROMOTE THE PHILIPPINES AS THE GO-TO LOCATION FOR MARITIME LEISURE AND ANCILLARY ACTIVITIES

The Program aims to develop and position the Philippines as Asia's hub for maritime tourism and water sports given its archipelagic configuration and its tropical climate, pristine waters and beautiful beaches. It also covers promotion of other ancillary services such as industries connected with chartering, insurance, loan, financing, managing, berthing, crewing, and crew payroll, among others.

LEGAL REFERENCES

The Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) derives its powers and functions from the following laws and orders issued by the Legislative and Executive Departments:

- 1. **Presidential Decree No. 474 (1974)** otherwise known as the **"Maritime Industry Decree of 1974"** creates the Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) and prescribes its powers and functions to accelerate the integrated development of the maritime industry of the Philippines.
- 2. **Executive Order No. 546 (1979).** Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) was attached to the Department of Transportation and Communications (DOTC) for policy and program coordination.
- 3. Executive Order No. 1011 (1985) entitled, "Establishing the Land Transportation Commission in the Ministry of Transportation and Communications, and for Other Purposes" particularly Section 13 thereof, transferred the quasi-judicial function relating to maritime transportation from the Board of Transportation (BOT) to the MARINA.

- 4. Executive Order No. 125/125-A (1987) entitled, "Reorganizing the Ministry of Transportation and Communications, Defining its Powers and Functions, and Other Purposes" vested upon the MARINA vessel registration functions, vessel safety regulatory functions and the issuance of the Seafarer Identification and Record Book or SIRB to Filipino seafarers, among others.
- 5. **Republic Act No. 9295 (2004)** also referred to as the **"Domestic Shipping Development Act of 2004**" deregulated the domestic shipping industry.
- 6. Republic Act No. 10635 (2014) entitled, "An Act Establishing the Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) as the Single Maritime Administration responsible for the Implementation and Enforcement of the 1978 International Convention on Standards of Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers, as amended and International Agreements or Covenants Related Thereto" designates the MARINA as the single maritime administration responsible for giving complete and full effect to the provisions of the STCW Convention in the Philippines. This enactment consolidates relevant maritime training and education functions originally discharged by 11 government agencies from different Departments.
