Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on August 16, 2020 in areas under MECQ, MGCQ and GCQ

HIGHLIGHTS


- Seventy-one percent (71%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Twenty-nine percent (29%) of the shipping operations were affected due to the measures implemented in view Code Red Sublevel 2 for the COVID-19.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 96% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 62%.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods amid MECQ, MGCQ, and GCQ is assured.



I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On August 16, 2020, there were 98 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 70 or 71% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 70 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Calabarzon Region at 27% and Bicol Region at 21%.

Meanwhile, 24% of the passenger and cargo shipping operations were cancelled, all due to the community quarantine measures imposed by the different local government units governing the ships' ports of destination. Mostly affected were operations in the Central Visayas and Eastern Visayas Regions.

Five (5) passenger ships or 7% encountered delays due to the additional measures adopted in view of COVID-19 such as temperature screening and inspections.

Lastly, no passenger and cargo shipping operation was not completed at the time of reporting.






Amid the measures in place due to MECQ, MGCQ, and GCQ, 27 out of 28 (96%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 1 general cargo ship, 1 LCT ship, 15 oil tankers and 10 Roro cargo ships.


Forty-three (43) passenger ships completed their voyage – 31 conventional passenger ships and 12 RoPax ships completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.


Meanwhile out of the 70 passenger ships, 39% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 27 passenger ships.
