

MARITIME INDUSTRY AUTHORITY SITUATION REPORT - 158

Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on August 28, 2020 in areas under MGCQ and GCQ

Data generated on August 28, 2020, 3:00 PM

HIGHLIGHTS

- Eighty-two percent (82%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Eighteen percent (18%) of the shipping operations were affected due to the measures implemented in view Code Red Sublevel 2 for the COVID-19.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 97% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 77%.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods amid MGCQ, and GCQ is assured.





PASSENGER AND CARGO SHIPPING OPERATIONS IN THE PHILIPPINES IN AREAS UNDER MGCQ and GCQ



I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On August 28, 2020, there were 234 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 193 or 82% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 193 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Central Visayas Region at 26% and Caraga Region at 20%.

Meanwhile, 10% of the passenger and cargo shipping operations were cancelled, all due to the community quarantine measures imposed by the different local government units governing the ships' ports of destination. Mostly affected were operations in the Central Visayas and Eastern Visayas Regions.

Seventeen (17) passenger ships or 10% encountered delays due to the additional measures adopted in view of COVID-19 such as temperature screening and inspections.

Lastly, no passenger and cargo shipping operation was not completed at the time of reporting.






Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 65 out of 67 (97%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 2 container ships, 60 LCT ships, 1 oil tanker and 2 Roro cargo ships.


One hundred and twenty-eight (128) passenger ships completed their voyage – 117 conventional passenger ships and 11 RoPax ships completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.


Meanwhile out of the 167 passenger ships, 23% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 39 passenger ships.
