

MARITIME INDUSTRY AUTHORITY SITUATION REPORT - 184

Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on September 23, 2020 in areas under MGCQ and GCQ

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HIGHLIGHTS

- Seventy-four percent (74%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Twenty-six percent (26%) of the shipping operations were affected due to the measures implemented in view Code Red Sublevel 2 for the COVID-19.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 85% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 72%.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods amid MGCQ, and GCQ is assured.





PASSENGER AND CARGO SHIPPING OPERATIONS IN THE PHILIPPINES IN AREAS UNDER MGCQ and GCQ



I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On September 23, 2020, there were 140 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 104 or 74% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 104 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 31% and Caraga Region at 18%.

Meanwhile, 12% of the passenger and cargo shipping operations were cancelled, all due to the community quarantine measures imposed by the different local government units governing the ships' ports of destination. Mostly affected were operations in the Central Visayas and Eastern Visayas Regions.

Sixteen (16) passenger ships or 14% encountered delays due to the additional measures adopted in view of COVID-19 such as temperature screening and inspections.

Lastly, no passenger and cargo shipping operation was not completed at the time of reporting.

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 23 out of 27 (85%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 1 chemical tanker, 1 LCT ship, 15 oil tanker and 6 Roro cargo ships.

Eight-one (81) passenger ships completed their voyage – 67 conventional passenger ships and 14 RoPax ships completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 113 passenger ships, 28% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 32 passenger ships.
