Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on October 25, 2020 in areas under MGCQ and GCQ

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**


- Sixty-five percent (65%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Thirty-five percent (35%) of the shipping operations were affected due to the measures implemented in view Code Red Sublevel 2 for the COVID-19.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 80% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 64%.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods amid MGCQ, and GCQ is assured.



## PASSENGER AND CARGO SHIPPING OPERATIONS IN THE PHILIPPINES IN AREAS UNDER MGCQ and GCQ



### I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On October 25, 2020, there were 80 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 52 or 65% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 52 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Calabarzon Region at 35% and Western Visayas Region at 33%.

Meanwhile, 33% of the passenger and cargo shipping operations were cancelled, all due to the community quarantine measures imposed by the different local government units governing the ships' ports of destination and in view of the tropical storm named "QUINTA". Mostly affected were operations in the Bicol Region and Eastern Visayas Regions.

One (1) passenger ships or 1% encountered delays due to the additional measures adopted in view of COVID-19 such as temperature screening and inspections.

Lastly, no passenger and cargo shipping operations was not completed at the time of reporting.

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 4 out of 5 (80%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 1 general cargo ships, 1 LCT ships, and 2 Roro cargo ships.

Forty Eight (48) passenger ships completed their voyage – 44 conventional passenger ships, 2 RoPax ships and 2 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 75 passenger ships, 36% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 27 passenger ships.
