



MARITIME INDUSTRY AUTHORITY SITUATION REPORT -234

Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on November 12, 2020
in areas under MGCQ and GCQ

HIGHLIGHTS

- Sixty-Nine percent (69%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Thirty-one percent (31%) of the shipping operations were affected due to the measures implemented in view Code Red Sublevel 2 for the COVID-19 and with the overwhelming effects cause by the current typhoon "ULYSSES".
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 72% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 66%.
- **With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods amid MGCQ, and GCQ is assured.**

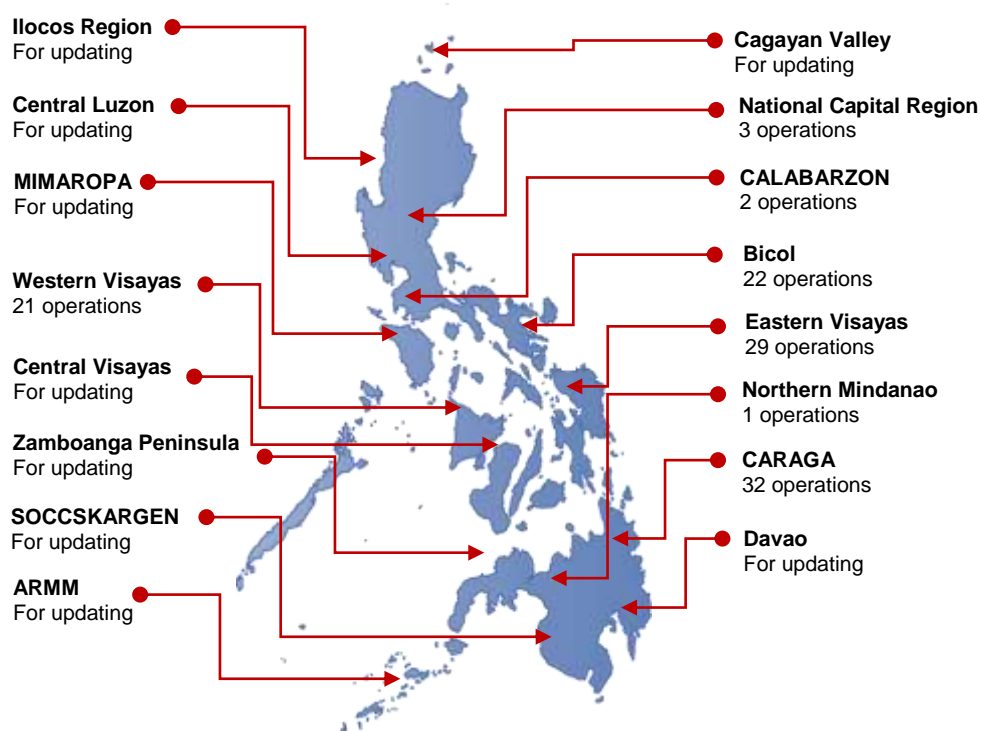

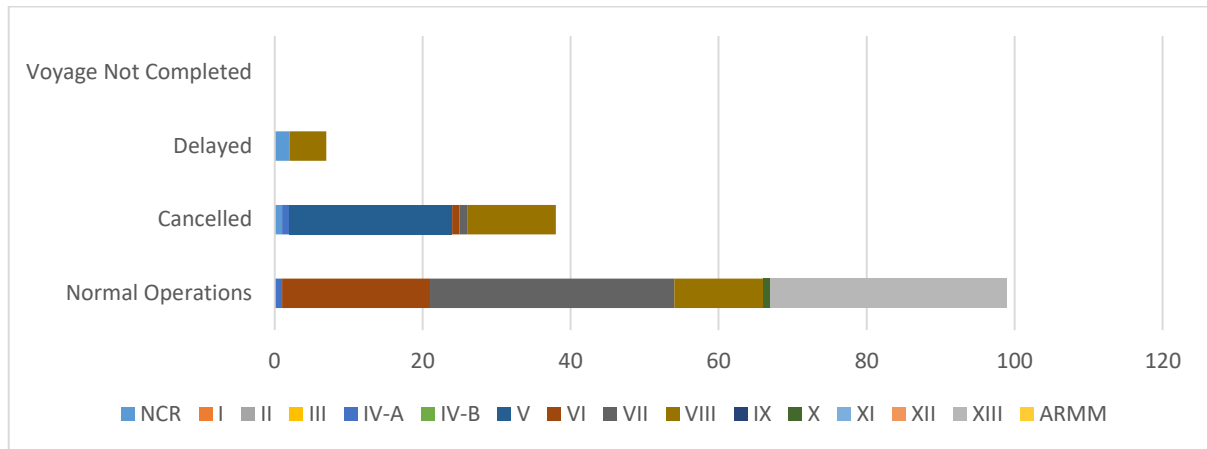

I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On November 12, 2020, there were 144 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 99 or 69% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 99 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Central Visayas Region at 33% and CARAGA Region at 32%.

Meanwhile, 26% of the passenger and cargo shipping operations were cancelled, all due to the community quarantine measures imposed by the different local government units governing the ships' ports of destination and with the effects brought about by the typhoon "ULYSSES". Mostly affected were operations in the Bicol and Eastern Visayas Regions.

Six (6) passenger ships or 7% encountered delays due to the additional measures adopted in view of COVID-19 such as temperature screening and inspections.

Lastly, no passenger and cargo shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting.

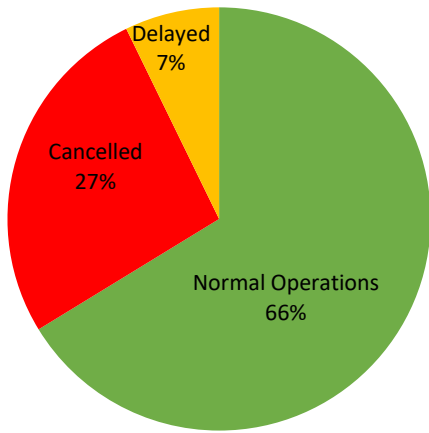

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 44 out of 61 (72%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 5 container ships, 1 general cargo ships, 18 LCT ships, 5 oil tankers, 15 Roro cargo ships.

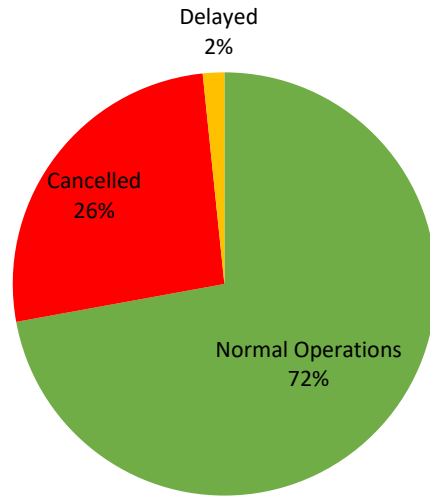
Fifty-five (55) passenger ships completed their voyage – 21 conventional passenger ships, 33 RoPax ships and 1 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 83 passenger ships, 34% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 28 passenger ships.

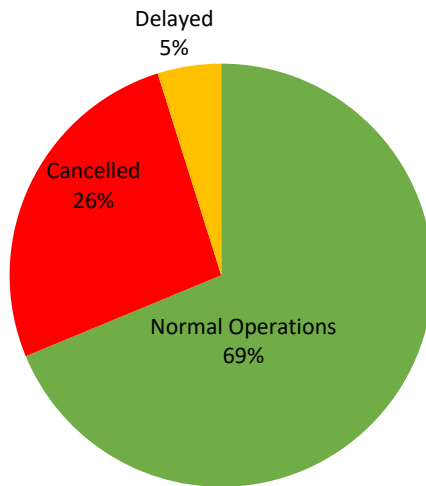
PASSENGER Ship Operations



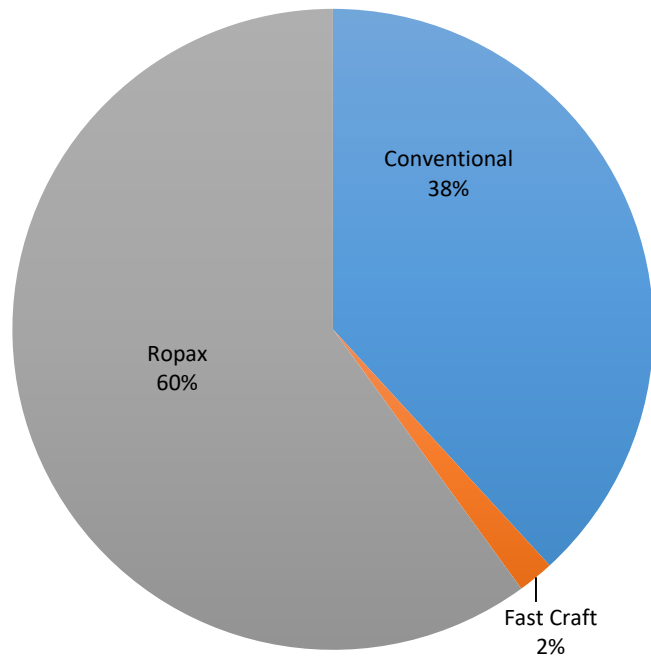
CARGO Ship Operations
