With the theme "On the Path to Maritime Recovery," the said annual technical learning, which was also led by SONAME Chairman Engr. Sammuel Lim and President Engr. Rizalito A. Lanoy, aims to give updates about the latest trends and insights in Philippine shipping and help participants become equipped to take advantage of the maritime recovery as COVID-19 vaccine roll-outs improve.

On the other hand, for the part of Naval Architects, this will also earn them Continuing Professional Development (CPD) units in compliance with the present Professional Regulations Commission policy for SONAME members.

During his keynote speech, Administrator Empedrad congratulated the passers, emphasizing that they may serve the nation with integrity and professionalism, as well as the Agency being in advantage for having them onboard. ## MARINA REGIONAL OFFICE IV LEADS TURNOVER CEREMONY FOR NEW LUCENA EXTENSION OFFICE

The Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA), through the MARINA Regional Office IV (MRO 4), led a turnover ceremony for the upcoming opening of the MARINA IV – Lucena Extension Office (LEXO) last Saturday, 10 July 2021, in line with its continued commitment to serve the riding public.

The building, which was formerly used as the Administration Building for the Philippine Fisheries Development Authority (PFDA), was leased to the MRO 4 for two (2) years.

MRO 4 Regional Director Engr. Emmanuel B. Carpio visited Lucena City last Friday, 09 July 2021 to facilitate the preparations for the official turnover ceremony. Additionally, Director Carpio also took this opportunity to properly brief the personnel who would soon be part of the regular workforce in the new office.

The ceremony was held last Saturday, 10 July 2021, and was participated by PFDA Port Manager Mr. Custodio Balaoing, who turned over the keys of the new office to Director Carpio. The ceremony also symbolized the passing of the building authority, unlocking new responsibilities for the MRO 4. The activity was attended by personnel from the PFDA, incoming LEXO staff, and other maritime agencies and stakeholders.

This initiative corresponds to the first point of MARINA Administrator Robert A Empedrad's "10-Point Agenda for the Maritime Industry" which entails increasing the capacity of the various MARINA Regional Offices (MROs). Under Administrator Empedrad's command, the MARINA continues to work towards opening more satellite offices to make the Agency's services more accessible in various areas in the country.

The MARINA IV- Lucena Extension Office (LEXO) was established to specifically address the needs of stakeholders located in far-flung areas, such as the Quezon Province and nearby communities. The LEXO is scheduled to start accepting applications beginning on 01 September 2021.



## MARINA, ALMA WELCOME 289 STRANDED FILIPINO SEAFARERS



The Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA), in coordination with the Association of Licensed Manning Agencies Maritime Group (ALMA), continues to ramp up its efforts to repatriate seafarers who are stranded overseas.

The Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA) Administrator Vice Admiral Robert A Empedrad AFP (Ret), together with Ms. Cristina Garcia, President of the Association of Licensed Manning Agencies Maritime Group (ALMA), led the welcoming of 289 Filipino seafarers who were previously stranded in various parts of the United Arab Emirates (UAE) on 15 June 2021 at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport.

Administrator Empedrad and Ms. Garcia were joined by Capt Jeffrey P Solon, MARINA Deputy Administrator for Planning, and Mr. Paul Galvez of MARLOW Navigation.

This chartered flight from Dubai is part of the ALMA's initiatives to assist distressed seafarers who have been affected by lockdowns abroad. Although many of these seafarers have only been stranded for 2-3 months, some have reported having been stranded for more than 4 months already.

Following the travel restrictions imposed in India, Bangladesh, United Arab Emirates, Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Oman, and Nepal last 01 May 2021, which was further extended until 30 June 2021, the ALMA Maritime Group organized non-Philippine government repatriation efforts following the implementation of the IATF Resolution 119 issued last 03 June 2021. "Proper coordination with relevant government agencies and affected manning agencies for our succeeding repatriation efforts are being done. We want to end our seafarers' ordeal and bring them home to their families. They deserve to have a muchneeded rest after a tough time serving on board ships." Garcia said.

"We welcome you back to your homeland. We have always dedicated our thoughts and prayers for you all while you were in foreign lands." Administrator Empedrad said to the repatriated seafarers. "I am grateful for the ALMA's continued dedication in helping ensure that our seafarers come back home safe and sound." He added, citing that the MARINA continues to push forward numerous initiatives for seafarers who have been hardly hit by the circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Agency has heared up to accelerate the processing of seafarer-related documents through the automation of its systems. In addition to this, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) will be signed by the Department of Transportation (DOTr), MARINO Partylist, and the Associated Marine Officers and Seamen's Union of the Philippines (AMOSUP), promising the construction of a 300-bed capacity Seafarers' Condotel The signing of the MOU was witnessed by the MARINA and the Philippine Ports Authority (PPA) last 17 June 2021.

### MARINA CONVENES 6TH INTER-AGENCY TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP (TWG) MEETING ON IMSAS



The 6th Inter-agency Technical Working Group (TWG) Meeting on IMSAS is an avenue to discuss issues in preparation for the International Maritime Organization (IMO) Member State Audit Scheme (IMSAS) in 2022.

As part of the country's preparation for the International Maritime Organization (IMO) Member State Audit Scheme (IMSAS) in 2022, the Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA), through the Overseas Shipping Service (OSS), convened the 6th Interagency Technical Working Group (TWG) Meeting on IMSAS via video conference on 08 June 2021.

Chaired by the OSS Officer-In-Charge, Ms. Precila C. Jara, the TWG shared views on the revised Cross Table of Responsibilities and the Philippine Maritime Strategy on the Implementation and Enforcement of Relevant IMO Instruments for 2020-2024. The TWG likewise discussed the IMSAS Pre-Audit Questionnaire, IMSAS Assessment, and the consolidated IMSAS Quality Manual.

The 6th Inter-agency Technical Working Group Meeting was attended by the representatives from the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG), Philippine Ports Authority (PPA), National Telecommunications Commission (NTC), and MARINA.

### MARINA REGIONAL OFFICE V CONTINUES CONDUCT OF MBST SESSIONS

In response to the needs and requests of local seafarers, fishing, and passenger vessel operators and stakeholders, the MARINA Regional Office V (MRO 5) continues to conduct Modified Basic Safety Training (MBST) sessions for seafarers in various areas. The MRO 5's areas of jurisdiction includes Albay, Masbate, Sorsogon, Camarines Sur, Camarines Norte, and Catanduanes (ALMASOR-CCC).

Last 11 June 2021, the MRO 5, through the Manpower Development Service (MDS) welcomed 25 trainees composed of boat owners, crew boat captains, and motormen who are all engaged in fishing, tourism and other maritime activities in the Bicol Region. The MSBT training was scheduled to take place for two days concluded last 12 June 2021.

The training will be composed of five (5) MBST modules, including Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting, Elementary First Aid, Personal Survival Technique, Personal Safety and Social Responsibility, and Typhoon Awareness.

Participants and MRO 5 personnel strictly followed the necessary health protocols such as wearing of face masks and face shields and observing physical distancing.
