**SUBJECT : IMPLEMENTATION OF MARINA ADVISORY NO. 2020-51 ON
THE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON PASSENGER
MANIFEST REQUIRED UNDER MARINA CIRCULAR NO. 180
FOR ADDITIONAL MEASURES FOR CONTACT TRACING**

In relation with the guidelines provided by the Inter – Agency Task Force (IATF) for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases on the Implementation of Alert Level System for COVID-19 Response, and taking into consideration that the National Capital Region (NCR) and most of the provinces and its Highly Urbanized Cities (HUCs), Independent Component Cities (ICCs), component cities and municipalities were now placed under Alert Level 1, the guidelines below on contact tracing shall be implemented:

“II. DETECT

A. Contact Tracing

2. Use of health declaration forms / paper-based contact tracing shall **not be required** for all the agencies and establishments.
3. Use of digital contact tracing such as the StaySafe.PH application **is optional** for all the agencies and establishments.

xxx...”

Relative thereto, the use of the format of passenger manifest prescribed under MARINA Advisory No. 2020-51 is hereby deemed **optional**, and the format prescribed under MARINA Circular No. 180, as amended shall be used in lieu thereof.

Further, please be informed that MARINA Advisory No. 2020-51 shall remain in force and effect until the COVID-19 pandemic still prevails in the country and shall be implemented taking into consideration the Guidelines on the Nationwide Implementation of Alert Level System for COVID-19 Response by the IATF for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases.
