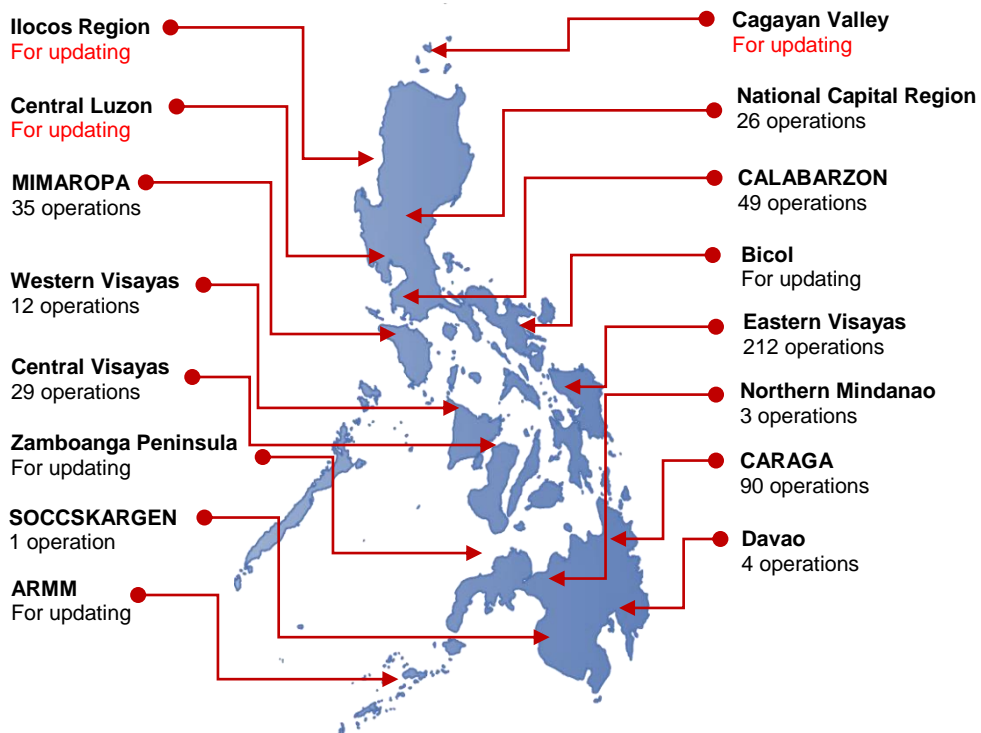
HIGHLIGHTS

- Ninety-eight percent (98%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Two percent (2%) of the shipping operations were affected.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 100% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 95%.
- Daily average passenger and cargo ship operations are 113 completed under normal conditions, 0 cancelled trips, 3 delayed and 0 not completed voyage.
- **With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods is assured.**

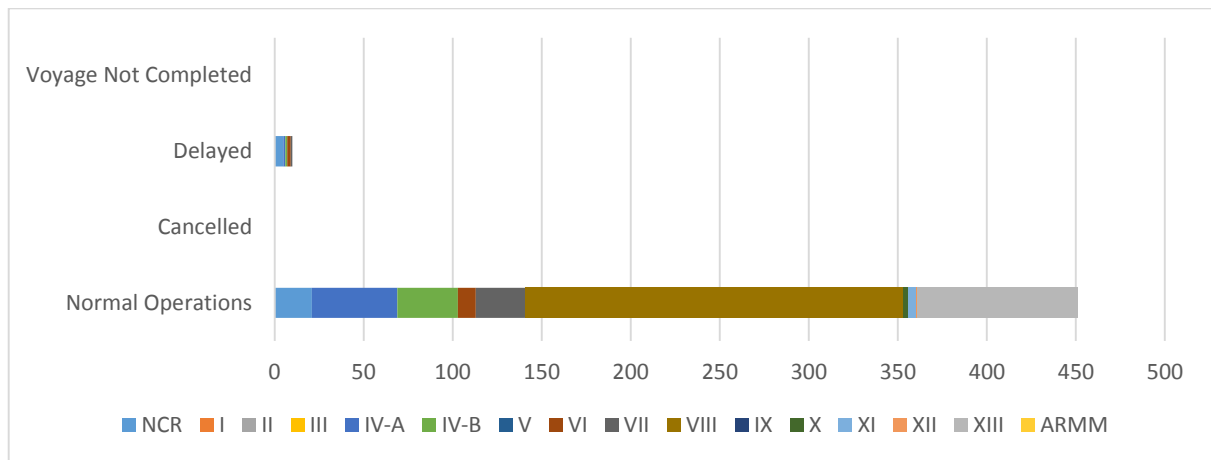

I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On Jan. 06-12, 2023, there were 461 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 451 or 98% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 451 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 47% and CARAGA Region at 20%.

Ten (10) passenger ships or 5% encountered delays.

No shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting, as the respective ships were still underway.

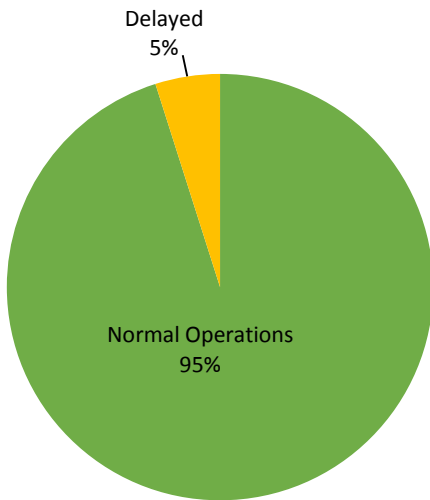

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 257 out of 257 (100%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 32 container ships, 32 LCT ships, 188 Roro cargo ships.

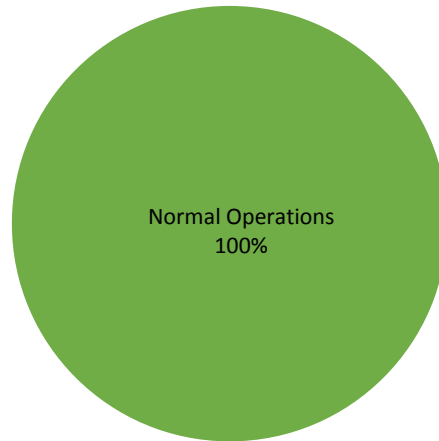
One hundred ninety four (194) passenger ships completed their voyage – 126 conventional passenger ships, 43 RoPax ships and 25 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 204 passenger ships, 5% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 10 passenger ships.

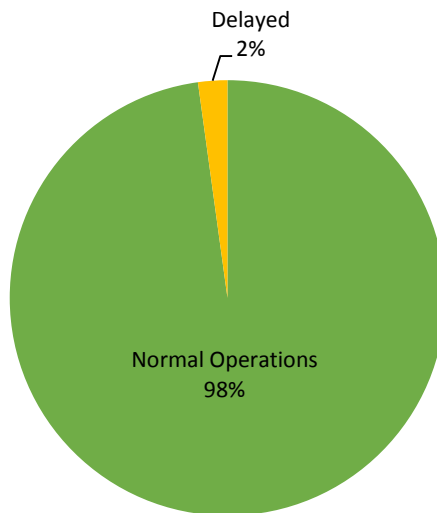
PASSENGER Ship Operations



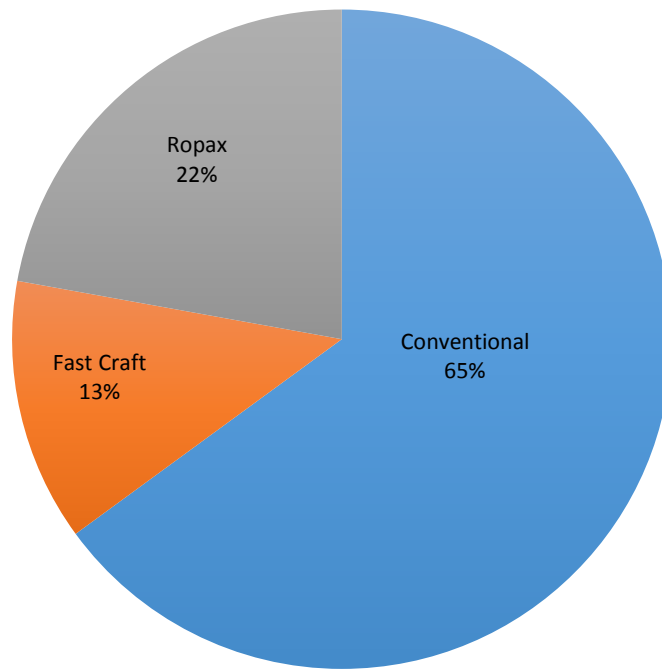
CARGO Ship Operations



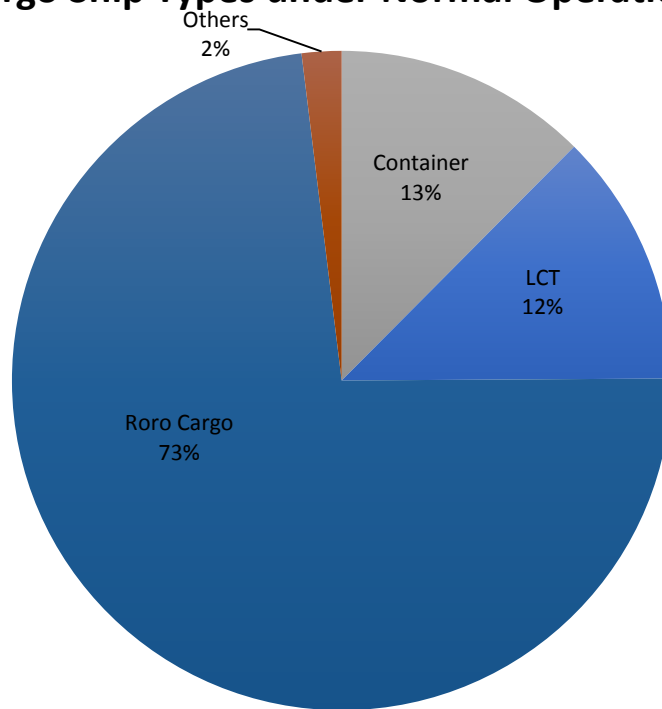

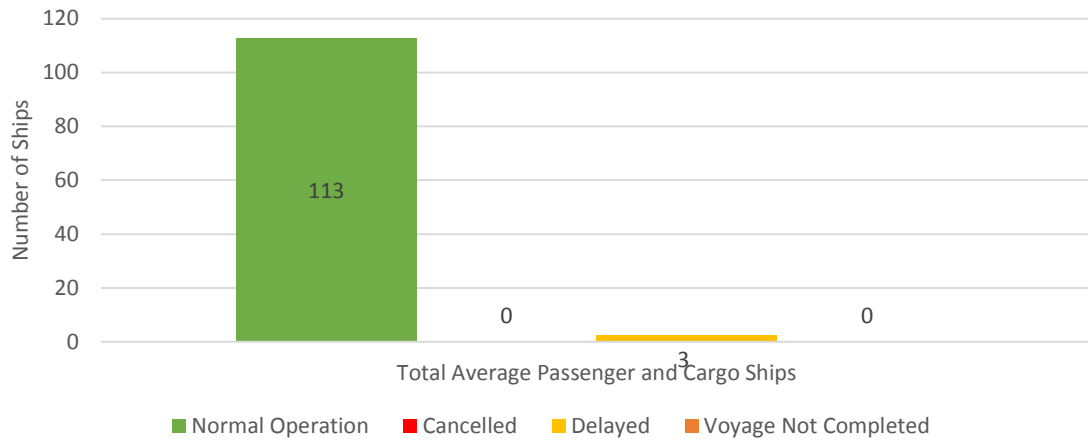
Passenger Ship Types under Normal Operations



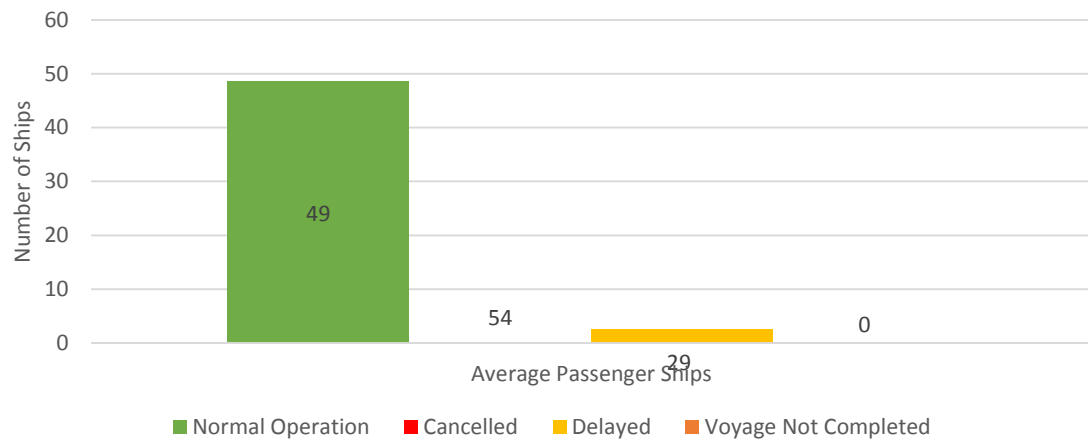
Cargo Ship Types under Normal Operations
