HIGHLIGHTS

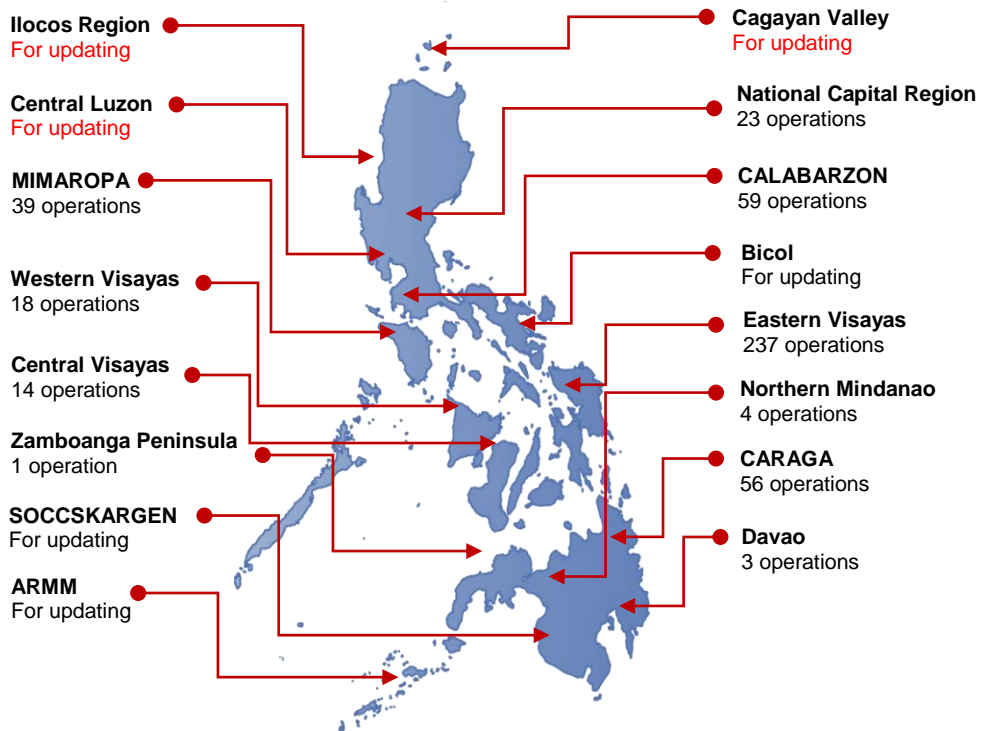
- Ninety-seven percent (97%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Three percent (3%) of the shipping operations were affected.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 100% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 94%.
- Daily average passenger and cargo ship operations are 110 completed under normal conditions, 0 cancelled trips, 3 delayed and 0 not completed voyage.
- **With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods is assured.**

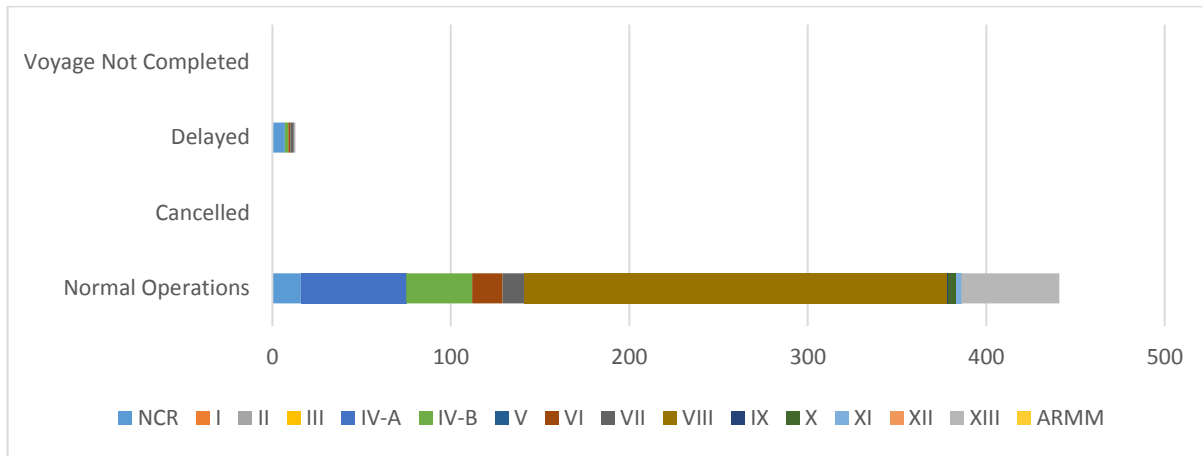

I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On Jan. 27 - Feb. 02, 2023, there were 454 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 441 or 97% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 441 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 54% and CALABARZON Region at 13%.

Thirteen (13) passenger ships or 6% encountered delays.

No shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting, as the respective ships were still underway.

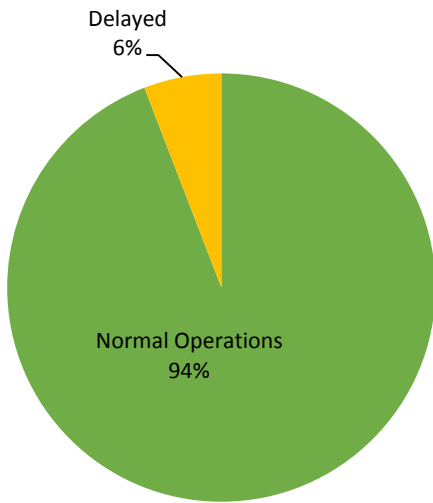

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 232 out of 232 (100%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 40 container ships, 36 LCT ships, 156 Roro cargo ships.

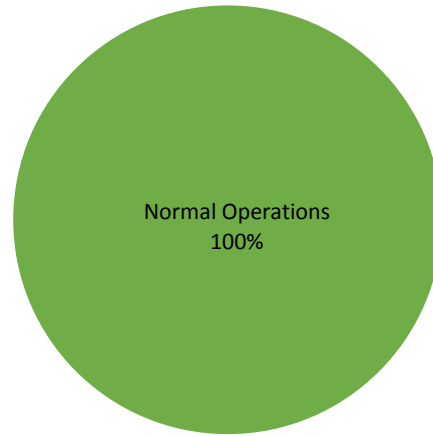
Two hundred and nine (209) passenger ships completed their voyage – 138 conventional passenger ships, 45 RoPax ships and 26 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 222 passenger ships, 6% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 13 passenger ships.

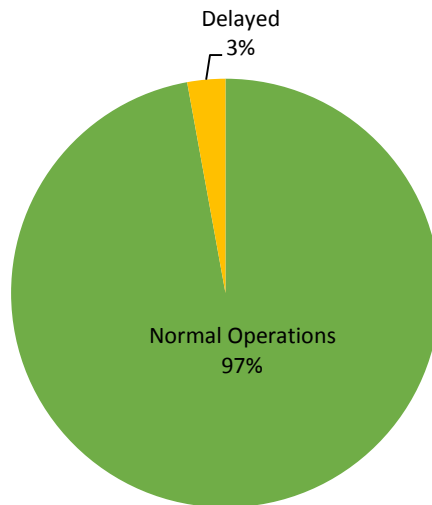
PASSENGER Ship Operations



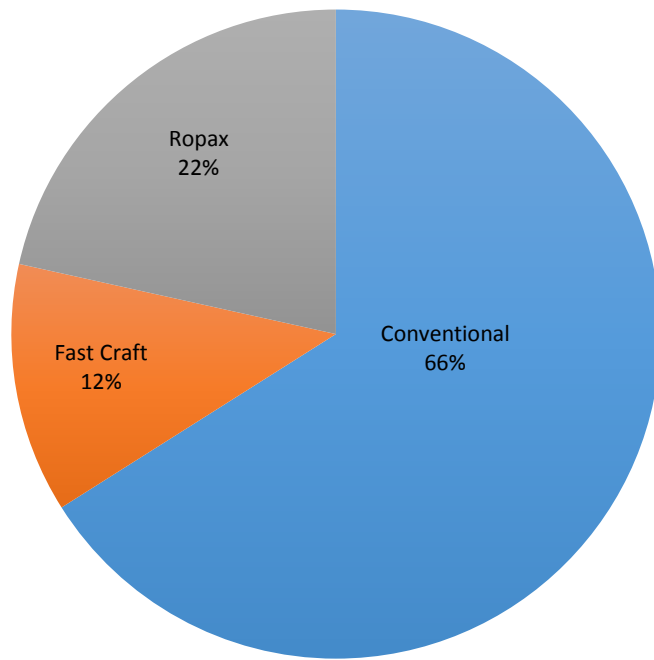
CARGO Ship Operations



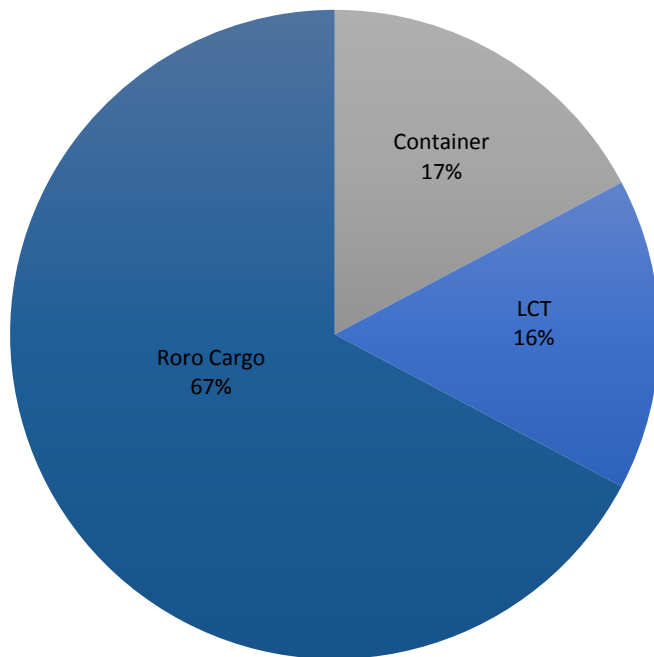

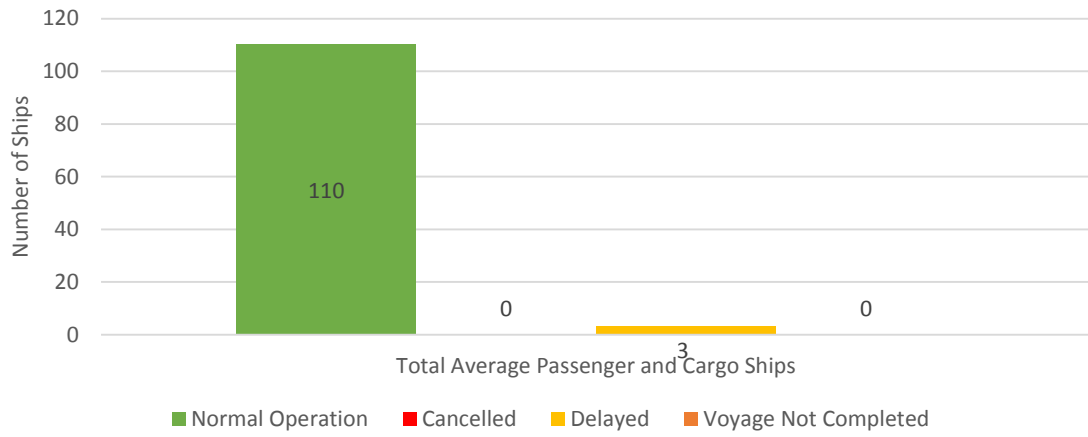
Passenger Ship Types under Normal Operations



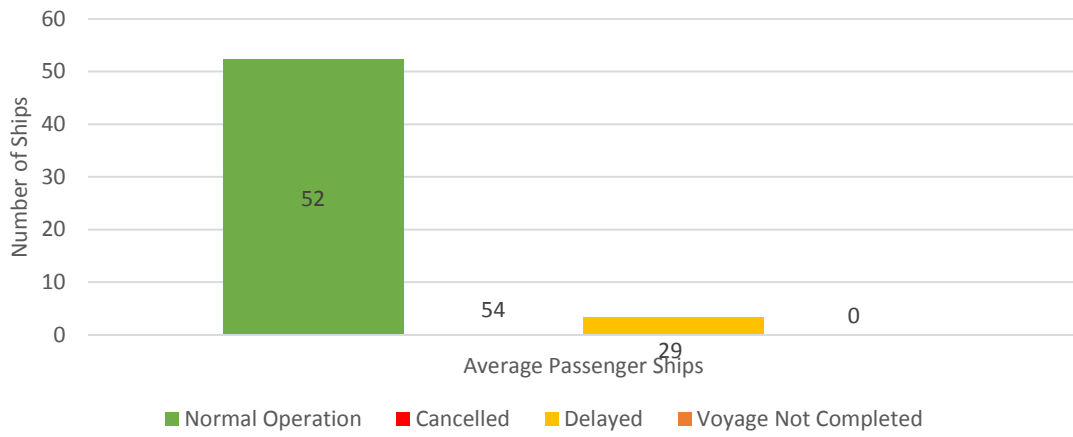
Cargo Ship Types under Normal Operations
