Passenger and Cargo Shipping Operations on Mar. 31 - Apr. 06, 2023 in areas under Alert Level 1 & 2

Data generated on Mar. 31 - Apr. 06, 2023, 3:00 PM

HIGHLIGHTS

- Ninety-eight percent (98%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Two percent (2%) of the shipping operations were affected.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 100% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 97%.
- Daily average passenger and cargo ship operations are 93 completed under normal conditions, 0 cancelled trips, 2 delayed and 0 not completed voyage.
- With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods is assured.





I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On Mar. 31 - Apr. 06, 2023, there were 380 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 373 or 98% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 373 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 53% and CALABARZON Region at 14%.

Seven (7) passenger ships or 3% encountered delays.

No shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting, as the respective ships were still underway.

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 173 out of 173 (100%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 32 container ships, 32 LCT ships, 122 Roro cargo ships.

Two hundred (200) passenger ships completed their voyage – 133 conventional passenger ships, 42 RoPax ships and 25 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 207 passenger ships, 3% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 7 passenger ships.
