HIGHLIGHTS

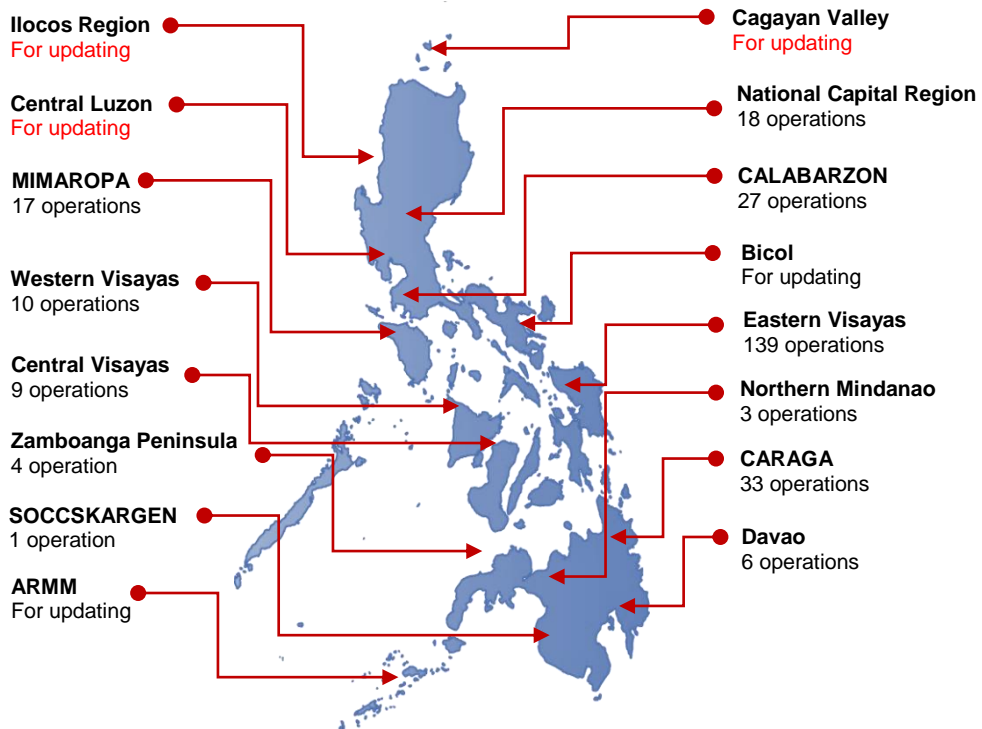
- Ninety-seven percent (97%) of passenger and cargo shipping operations were completed in accordance with the ships' CPC.
- Three percent (3%) of the shipping operations were affected.
- Operations of passenger ships were more affected compared to cargo ships. 100% of the cargo shipping operations were completed under normal conditions compared to passenger ships at 93%.
- Daily average passenger and cargo ship operations are 65 completed under normal conditions, 0 cancelled trips, 2 delayed and 0 not completed voyage.
- **With cargo shipping still operational, transport of goods is assured.**

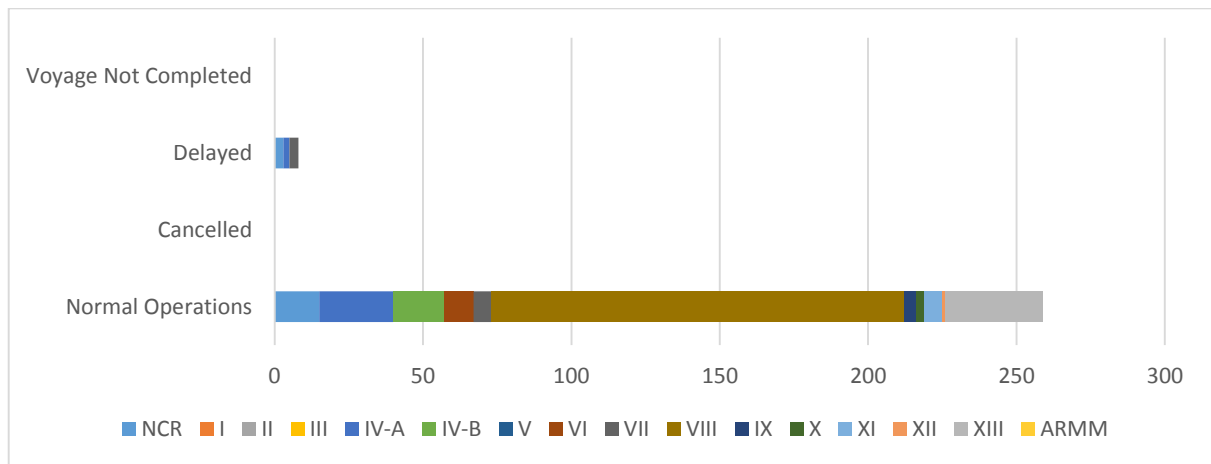

I. STATUS OF SHIPPING OPERATIONS NATIONWIDE



On May 26 - Jun. 01, 2023, there were 267 passenger and cargo shipping operations conducted wherein 259 or 97% were completed in accordance with their Certificate of Public Convenience (CPC).

Out of the 259 operations completed under normal conditions, the reported movements were mostly in the Eastern Visayas Region at 54% and CARAGA Region at 13%.

Eight (8) passenger ships or 7% encountered delays.

No shipping operations were not completed at the time of reporting, as the respective ships were still underway.

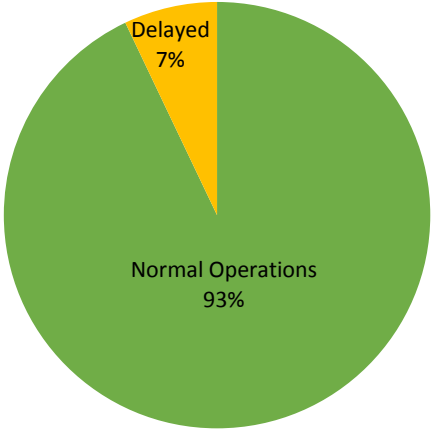

Amid the measures in place due to MGCQ, and GCQ, 154 out of 154 (100%) cargo ships still operated normally – are 34 container ships, 6 general cargo ships, 23 LCT ships, 72 Roro cargo ships.

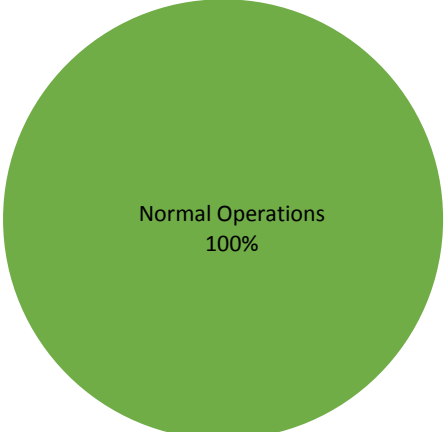
One hundred five (105) passenger ships completed their voyage – 56 conventional passenger ships, 29 RoPax ships and 14 fast craft ferry completed their operations but mostly only carried cargoes during their voyage.

Meanwhile out of the 113 passenger ships, 7% were affected by the measures adopted in view of COVID-19. These measures caused either the cancellation, delay, or uncompleted operations of 8 passenger ships.

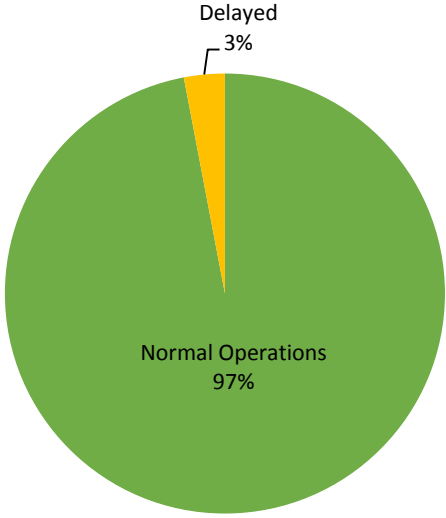

Ship Operations**



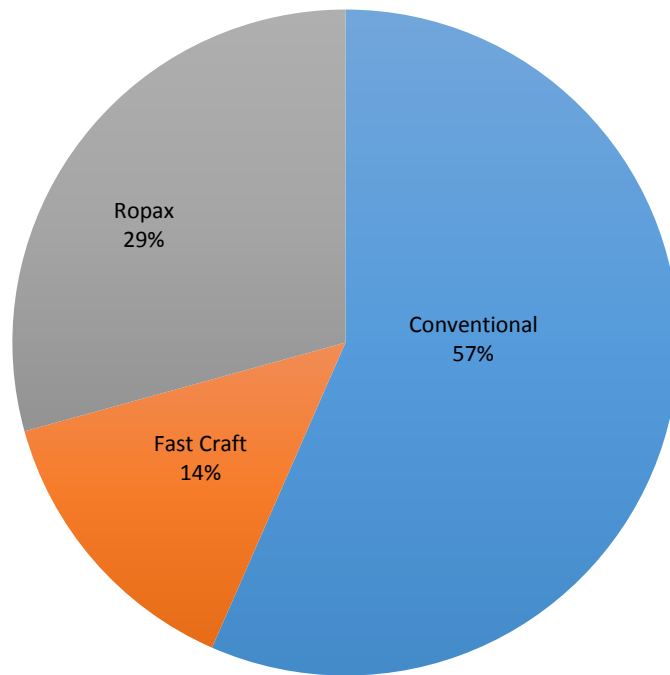
**CARGO
Ship Operations**



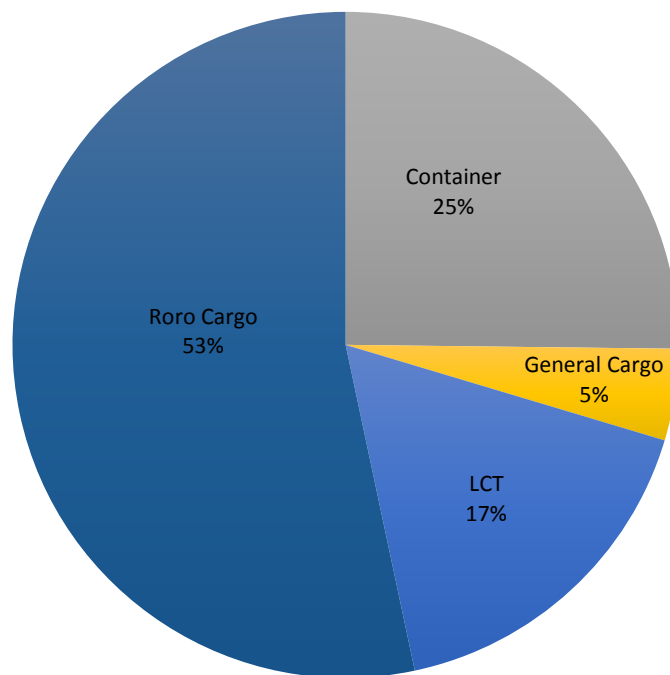

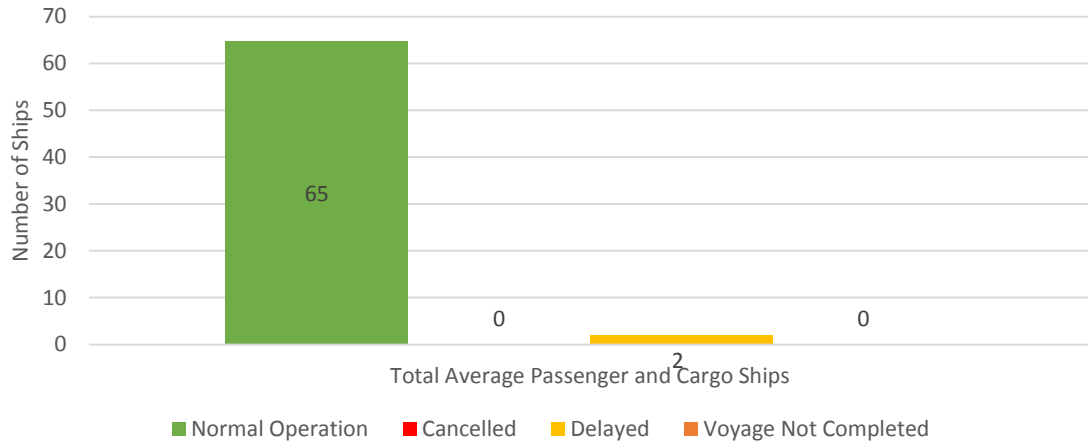
Passenger Ship Types under Normal Operations



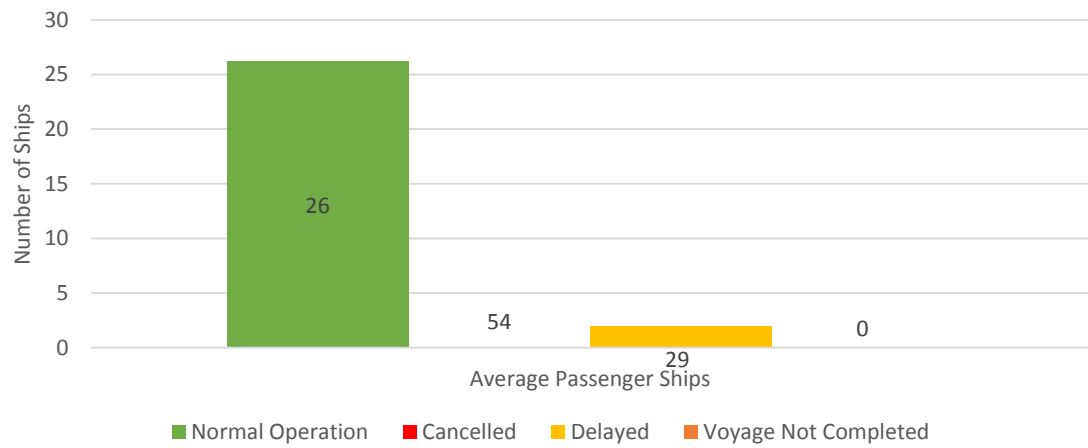
Cargo Ship Types under Normal Operations
